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Velkommen til forårsauktion

Vi begynder det nye år i Bredgade med en international auktion over kunst, antikviteter, smykker og moderne design. Og hvad er mere passende end at gå foråret i møde med kunst fra den berømte kunstnerkoloni i Skagen? Der er i hvert fald dømt blå himmel, klart hav og kvinder i lyse gevandter i en række malerier, der er skabt af nogle af dansk kunsts største navne. De tog afsæt i det livgivende lys og malede på mesterlig vis det smukkeste frem på Danmarks nordligste punkt. Det gælder ikke mindst i samlingen efter Holst-slægten, der gennem generationer har bidraget til Skagens driftige miljø. Her finder man især skildringer af Holsts egne døtre – Minne, Sophie, Ida og Anna – udført med stor indlevelse af Michael Ancher for ikke at tale om P.S. Krøyers fine søstykke (kat.nr. 49-59).

Hvis man vil sige det med blomster præsenterer vi fra både danske og udenlandske samlinger ikke mindre end 10 blomstermotiver af I.L. Jensen, de fleste med lyserøde roser (kat.nr. 28-38).

Det er ikke ofte, at man ser juveler i verdensklasse på det danske marked! Det er imidlertid tilfældet nu, hvor vi åbner dørene til et skatkammer uden lige med en samling af ekstravagante diamantsmykker – alle med en usædvanlig fin slibning, klarhed og høj karat. De stammer fra konkursboet efter Stein Bagger og IT Factory og sælges på begæring af kammeradvokaten. De mest markante er kat.nr. 334, 315 og 299.

Omkring år 1800 bød man ofte sine gæster på punch. De allermest berømte punchebowler er dem fra Den Kongelige Porcelainsfabrik med motiver af Slaget på Reden. Prospektet på den udbudte bowle er lavet efter C.A. Lorentzens berømte maleri, der i dag hænger på Det Nationalhistoriske Museum på Frederiksborg Slot (kat.nr. 237).

Blandt kineserierne tæller højdepunkterne en sjælden Qianlong familie rose tekande fra 1736-1795, der er dekoreret i stærke farver og udsmykket med Fo-hunde, lotusblomster og et dragehoved (kat. nr. 199). Den får følgeskab af et par Yongzheng porcelænsskåle fra 1723-1735, som stammer fra samlingen efter direktør Henrik V. Jacobsen fra Østasiatisk Kompagni og i sin tid har været udstillet på Kunstinstituttmuseet, i dag Designmuseum Danmark (kat.nr. 192).

En interessant proveniens har også et tysk møntkabinet i nøddetræ fra begyndelsen af 1700-tallet, som bærer Johann Heinrich Burckhardts (1676-1738) våben og spejlmonogram. Han var hofråd og livlæge ved fyrstehoffet i Wolfenbüttel og blev kendt for sit pionerarbejde inden for botanikken. Burckhardt var en ivrig samler af bøger, naturalier, kuriosa og mønster, og en del af rammen om hans samling var fem kabinetter. Fire af dem befinner sig i dag i samlinger og private hjem rundt omkring i Tyskland, og det femte har vi altså her fornøjelsen af at udbyde (kat.nr. 502).

Fra den over 700 år gamle herregård Steensgaard på Fyn stammer en af auktionens samlinger, og her finder man blandt andet et flamsk renæssancekabinet af skildpadde og ibenholt fra slutningen af 1600-tallet for ikke at tale om en marmorskulptur af en stående yngling, som Lensgreve Henrik Bille Brahe efter sigende skulle have hjembragt fra en rejse til Rom sidst i 1700-tallet (kat.nr. 482 og 488).

Welcome to the spring auction

We're starting the New Year at Bredgade with an international auction of art, antiques, jewellery and modern design. And what better way to welcome the spring than with art from the famous artists' colony in Skagen? Blue skies, clear water and women in light robes certainly feature in a great many of the auction's paintings created by some of the biggest names in Danish art. Inspired by the life-giving light, they masterfully captured the beauty of the northernmost tip of Denmark. This is especially true of the collection of the Holst family, which for generations has contributed to Skagen's industrious environment. Particularly noteworthy are portraits of Holst's own daughters – Minne, Sophie, Ida and Anna – painted with great empathy by Michael Ancher not to mention P.S. Krøyer's fine seascape (lot 49-59).

If you want to say it with flowers, we have no fewer than 10 floral motifs from the middle of 19th century by I.L. Jensen from Danish and foreign collections, most of them with pink roses (lot 28-38).

It's not every day you see world-class jewels on the Danish market! You will now, however, when we open the doors to an unequalled treasury featuring a unique collection of extravagant diamond jewellery – all with unusually fine cuts, clarity and high carats. They come from the bankruptcy estate of Stein Bagger and IT Factory, and are being sold at the request of the Attorney General. The most notable are lot 334, 315 and 299.

In the early 1800s, it was customary to offer one's guests a glass of punch. The most famous punch bowls of them all are those from Den Kongelige Porcelainsfabrik featuring motifs of the Battle of Copenhagen – a landmark event in Danish military history. The prospect on the bowl up for auction is based on C.A. Lorentzen's famous painting which today can be seen at The Museum of National History at Frederiksborg Castle (lot 237).

In the department for Chinese decorative art, the highlights include a rare Qianlong famille rose teapot from 1736-1795, decorated in bright colours and adorned with Foo dogs, lotus flowers and a dragon head (lot 199). It is joined by a pair of Yongzheng porcelain bowls from 1723-1735 from the collection of Henrik V. Jacobsen, Director of Østasiatisk Kompagni, which have previously been exhibited at Kunstmuseet, now Designmuseum Danmark (lot 192).

An early 18th century German coin cabinet in walnut bearing Johann Heinrich Burckhardt's (1676-1738) crest and mirror monogram is another lot with an interesting provenance. He was a court official and physician-in-ordinary in Wolfenbüttel, famous for his pioneering work in botany. Burckhardt was an avid collector of books, specimens, curiosities and coins, some of which he kept in five cabinets. Four of them are today either in collections or in private ownership in Germany, and we have the pleasure of offering the fifth up for auction (lot 502).

From the over 700-year-old manor house Steensgaard on Funen comes one of the auction's collections, which includes a Flemish renaissance cabinet of tortoiseshell and ebony from the late 17th century and a marble sculpture of a standing favourite that Count Henrik Bille Brahe is said to have brought home with him from a trip to Rome in the late 18th century (lot 482 and 488).



The painting was carried out in Rome in 1839 while Christen Købke was making a similar one. The two friends painted next to each other. Købke's painting is owned by Nasjonalmuseet in Oslo.

Literature: "Kunst i Privat Eje", 1945 vol. II p. 44, here reproduced next to Købke's painting of Krohn. (Hjalmar Bruhn). When the painting was sold in 1972 at Bruun Rasmussen the catalogue text mentioned: "Krohn in capt. Kronstrand's costume returned from Egypt 1839".

Provenance: Baroness Christine Stampe, Nysø, a good friend of the sculptor Bertel Thorvaldsen, bought the painting in Rome 1841, it was inherited by her son Henrik, then his daughter Christine married to prefect and chamberlain Vilh. Bardenfleth in his first marriage. After his death sold to Hjalmar Bruhn, his auction, ABR 176, 1972 no. 2.

F. C. Krohn (1806-1883) was a medallist at the Royal Mint in Copenhagen 1841-1873. Before that he went on a long trip from 1835-1839 to Berlin, Dresden, Vienna, Munich and Rome. He left Denmark travelling with his good friend the painter Constantin Hansen on the first part of the trip.

The Greek painter Ioannis (Jean) Altamuras is often described as the "Greek Skagen painter". King George I (The Danish prince Wilhelm) discovered Altamuras' talent for painting and helped him to join the Academy of Fine Arts in Copenhagen. Altamuras was only 20 years old when he arrived and spent three years in Denmark. He met Michael Ancher, who also found out, that he was a gifted painter and they became friends. Through him Altamuras befriended Anna Ancher, Holger Drachmann and P. S. Krøyer. He was inspired by the Skagen painters, and he even went to sea with the frigate "Jylland" to get the right knowledge of the maritime world.

Altamuras painted Øresund and Kronborg many times during his stay in Denmark. See "Jean Altamuras. His life and works", 2011 pp. 103, 124, 197-201.

All three titles could match up to the present painting.

After several visits to Paris he learned to express his soul's quietness and melancholy in his delicate still life paintings as in this one. He visited Skagen in 1910 and 1911. He was at that time a successful painter and teacher in America.

Suzanne Ludvigsen writes enthusiastically about the small interior in "Maleren Dankvart Dreyer", vol. I, p. 230: "Det lille, stramme og gyldne billede fremstår i en beåndet udførelse i slægt med kirkeinteriører malet af andre af tidens kunstnere som for eksempel Christen Købke". The small tight and golden painting is executed in an inspired way that resembles other church interiors painted by fellow artists like Christen Købke.

Filsø or Fiilsø was earlier the second largest lake in Denmark, the size was more than 30 square meters. In the middle of the 19th century the farmers began to drain the lake to get more farmland. This continued until the 1940ies. In the last part of the 20th century part of the land was preserved and was appointed international protected wetlands (a nature reserve). It has recently been decided to re-establish the lake in 2012 with the help of Aage V. Jensen's Nature Foundation.

Johannes Larsen was fond of painting around Filsø, where especially rising swans fascinated him.

The family has given its name to a large typical yellow merchant's house in the centre of Skagen, where the family lived and where Lars Kjelder Holst had his general store and also to "Huset Holst", today a modern hardware store also in the centre of Skagen.

Lars Kjelder Holst (1838-1927), borough treasurer, merchant and counsellor. He was active in making Skagen a prosperous town and the Holst family is still active there. Lars Holst built a post office on his own grounds. The building later housed the "Skagen Bank" on the initiative of Lars Holst. He was a member of the local Town Council for a generation. Lars Holst worked for the establishment of the new harbour and the railway.

An important person who was known by everyone in Skagen. Lars Holst was nicknamed "King Lars". He was a relative to Anna Ancher and knew all the painters who visited or lived in Skagen. Paintings were dedicated to him.

Lars Holst had five lovely daughters Johanne, the eldest one, who left Skagen after her marriage, Ida, Anna, Vilhelmine (Minne) and Sophie. They were called "The five Nordic swans". They were often used as models especially in Michael Ancher's paintings and Helga Ancher was a good friend of the girls.

Already back in the 1870s Krøyer travelled to the small fishing village of Hornbæk, where the locals inspired him to do numerous paintings showing the life of the fishermen and their families. In 1882 he visited Skagen for the first time, a place that would become central for his work as an artist in the years to come and until his death in 1909. In 1885 he painted the monumental "Fiskere ifærd med at stryge Sejlene" (Fishermen homeward bound taking in the sails) that was exhibited at Charlottenborg the year after.

Here once again Krøyer captures a moment of the local fishermen's daily life. They have just returned from the sea and are getting ready to leave the boat. It is a powerful composition that is enhanced by the polarity of light and darkness in the sky and sea and the men in the boat.



This cabinet belonged to the botanist Johann Heinrich Burckhardt (1676-1738), a court official and physician-in-ordinary in the princely court of Wolfenbüttel, which was the seat of the Duchy of Brunswick-Wolfenbüttel at the time. The cabinet is one of a total of five that can be traced back to Johann Heinrich Burckhardt. The cabinets all bear his crest and mirror monogram. Two of them are on display in Germany. One is in the castle in Wolfenbüttel and the other is part of the Badisches Landesmuseum collections in Karlsruhe; the other three cabinets are in private ownership, one in Augsburg, one in Paris since 1984 and

this one in Copenhagen, which is now up for sale. The cabinets were produced in the period 1715-1725 and were probably crafted locally in either Wolfenbüttel or Brunswick, renowned for their superb cabinetmaking in this period.

Burckhardt had a reputation as a great collector; at the time of his death, he had a collection of as many as 6,735 books- a particularly remarkable achievement back then. The cabinets were where he kept his large collections of specimens, curiosities and his extensive coin collection.

Posterity remembers Burckhardt especially for his pioneering work in the field of botany. He corresponded with figures including Leibnitz and proposed in a letter from 1702 that plants could be classified based on their fruiting; thus, he pre-empted ground-breaking Swedish botanist Carl Linnaeus' system five years before Linnaeus was born.

Telephone bidding is possible within certain conditions made out by Bruun Rasmussen. Bruun Rasmussen is not to be held responsible for any errors that may occur using this service. The auctioneer shall have absolute discretion as to the increment of the bids. The auctioneer will also make decisions in all cases of doubt regarding the bidding.

Credit/debit card information must be registered with Bruun Rasmussen before bids can be submitted at our online auctions.

§ 2. PAYMENT

Purchases made at all Bruun Rasmussen online auctions are subject to a 25% fee, which covers 20% buyer's premium and VAT of the premium.

Purchases made at all Bruun Rasmussen traditional salesroom auctions are subject to a 30% fee (for wines, coins and stamps 25%), which covers 24% buyer's premium plus VAT of the premium.

The purchase price falls due for payment when the goods have been knocked down. Payment may be made in cash up to DKK 100,000, by Dankort, banker's cheque, traveller's cheque, Visa-, Master-, Diners Club- or Eurocard. Personal foreign cheques may only be used for payment by prior arrangement.

§ 3. MONEY-BACK GUARANTEE

Online purchase of items by private individuals is subject to Danish consumer law, which extends 14 days of money-back guarantee. The purchaser is liable for any costs related to the transport of returned items.

Should a purchaser seek to avail himself or herself of the money-back guarantee, Bruun Rasmussen will refund the payment on receiving the returned items. Please note that the date on which accounts are debited is subject to the policy of the purchaser's bank/credit card company.

§ 4. EXEMPTION FROM VAT

International purchasers, who fulfill the conditions stipulated below, must pay a fee of 24% of the auction price at traditional salesroom auctions and a 20% fee of auction prices for items purchased online. They are exempt from the payment of Danish VAT.:.

A. Buyers residing in another EU Member State:

The invoice must have been paid and the Danish duty of 25% of the invoice amount must have been deposited with Bruun Rasmussen.

- a Buyers residing in Norway will be refunded the Danish VAT as soon as the invoice of sale has been returned to Bruun Rasmussen endorsed by the customs authorities of the country in question or by any other authority with jurisdiction over matters of purchase tax with respect to official imports of goods into the country in question if the purchase price exceeds DKK 1,200.
- b Buyers residing in other countries outside the EU will be refunded the Danish VAT after the goods have been presented for customs clearance in connection with the departure of the buyer from the EU. The exporter's form should be returned to Bruun Rasmussen after being endorsed with the customs authorities' export certificate if the purchase price exceeds DKK 300. This also applies to the Faroe Islands and Greenland.

§ 5. PAYMENT OF TAXES AND DUTIES

§ 6. COLLECTION OF PURCHASES

Where such a licence has not been obtained, the foreign buyer will be informed thereof immediately after the lot has been knocked down to the buyer. Another application will subsequently be sent to the Danish Cultural Assets Committee by Bruun Rasmussen on behalf of the buyer, now that the price is known. Should an export licence not be granted, the Danish Cultural Assets Committee would be obliged to acquire the purchased lot at the purchase price, and the buyer would thus not be bound to the purchase.
